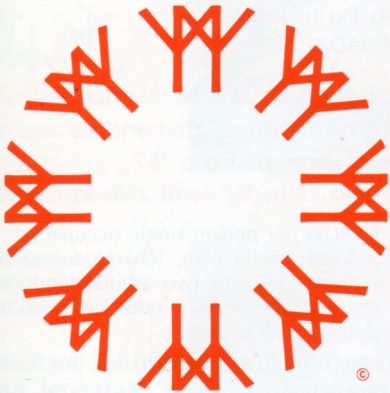

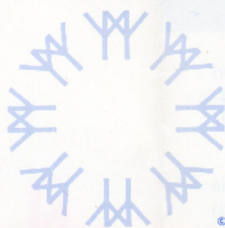

**FIRST DAY** — This morning we head northward via the New York State Thruway and the recently completed Northway. Rest and luncheon stops are made enroute. Using the superparkways we arrive in Montreal at approximately 6:00 P.M. Our accommodations for the next three nights will be at the brand new Lafayette Motel. The motel is ideally situated one minute's walk from the Longueuil station of the Montreal subway and two and a half minutes ride to the Expo '67 station of the subway. Located just south of the Expo site, you can view the nightly fireworks display from the motel.

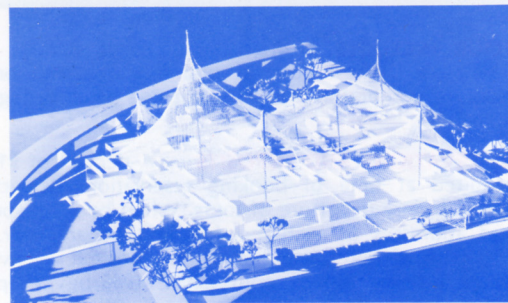
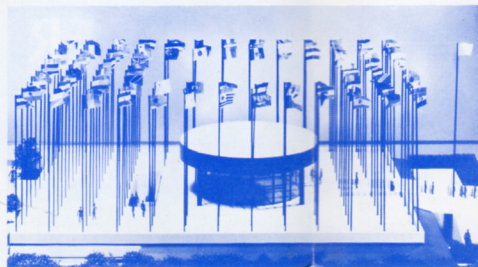
**SECOND DAY** — This morning our motorcoach will transport us to the main gate of Expo (two admissions to Expo included in tour cost.) Free transportation through the four main exhibit areas is provided on the Expo Express. You may board this unique electric train at any station along the route and ride as often or as far as you choose. And there will be much to see at Expo! Using the theme of "Man and His World", the Exhibition presents a kaleidoscope of man's progress, his aspirations and his future. In a wonderland of imaginative pavilions you will see man's endeavors in a score of different fields. With over seventy nations participating, Expo '67 is officially supported by almost all of the principal world governments. Stay as long as you like — you can return to the Lafayette Motel by subway at any hour you choose.

**THIRD DAY** — Another full day to enjoy Expo! Convenient round-trip transportation to Expo will be available via the Montreal subway. See the Canadian Pavilion, celebrating the Centennial of the Confederation; the African complex, a salute to the emerging nations; the United States Pavilion, emphasizing the genius of Americans in the arts and technology and the Pavilion of the U.S.S.R. with its 1100 seat restaurant serving national dishes. Add to these outstanding displays the magic of a million reflected lights dancing on the waters, a thousand flags, fountains and bands and you have the spectacle of a lifetime.

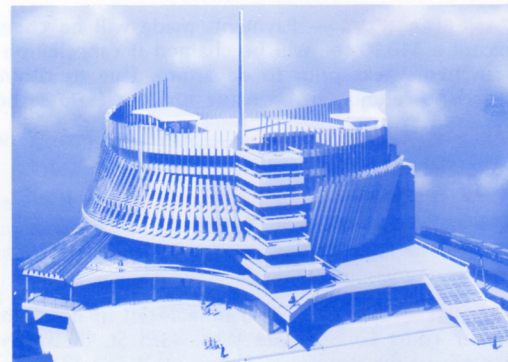

UN Pavilion at Expo 67

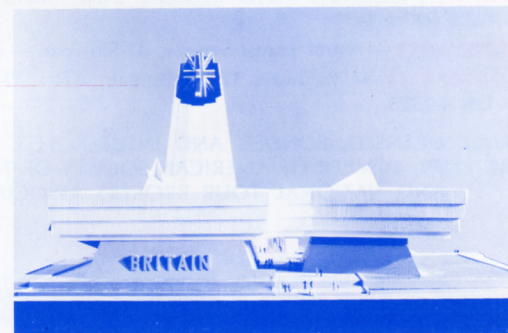

German Pavilion

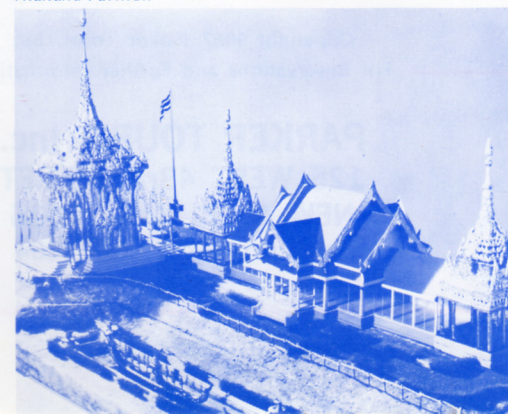


French Pavilion

# GENERAL INFORMATION

**TOUR INCLUDES** — Transportation via deluxe, air-conditioned motorcoach, finest hotel accommodations with private bath, admissions and gratuity for handling one piece of luggage. No meals included.

**RESERVATIONS AND DEPOSITS** — A deposit of \$10 per person is required at time of booking reservation. Balance payable two weeks before departure of tours. When booking specify full names and addresses of each member in the party (Mr. Mrs. or Miss) and type of hotel accommodations desired — twin — single or share a twin-bedded room (Share will be accepted subject to filling same, otherwise reservations will be protected only at single room rate) — and departure point. Telephone reservations will be held three days pending receipt of deposit.

**CANCELLATIONS** — Payments made will be cheerfully refunded, except a \$10.00 fee will be charged if cancellation is effected less than two weeks prior to departure. Due to contractual arrangements no refund can be made for tour features not used.

**SEATING ARRANGEMENTS** — Seat assignments on reserved seat basis. No rotation of seats on this tour.
