# THE WORLD FESTIVAL EXPO 67

Expo 67 is the abbreviated title of the Universal and International Exhibition of 1967 . . . taking place in Montreal, Canada from April 28th to October 27th, 1967.

One part of Expo 67 is The World Festival . . . a unique programme of the performing arts, spectaculars, sports and folkloric entertainment from six continents.

Daily World Festival events take place in seven locations . . . three theatres in the Place des Arts complex St. Catherine Street, West, (Salle Wilfrid Pelletier, Théâtre Maisonneuve, Théâtre Port Royal); Expo Theatre and the Automotive Stadium, in Cité du Havre: the Garden of Stars on La Ronde and Place des Nations.

Garden of Stars: (situated in La Ronde, Expo's enormous amusement park)

- Morning shows for children,

- Twilight "Action Time" for teenagers,
- International Night Club for adults.

Place des Nations: a vast outdoor plaza for free entertainment seating 8,000, presenting daily the dance, music, sports and ethnic participation of the 70 contributing countries including the official visits of heads of state.

The Bandshell Festival: five free outdoor arenas featuring dancers, choirs, steelbands, roving troubadours, the marching Expo band, clowns and magicians.
