La Ronde runs from noon to 2:30 a.m. on weekends; 1 p.m. to 2:30 a.m. weekdays from June 22, when Man & His World opens.

Prices for every pocket

A season Visa for Man & His World gives free admission to La Ronde. (Single admission without Visa costs 50 cents.)

Citizens receiving social welfare benefits or old-age pension may obtain a Visa free of charge upon presentation of the proper pieces of identification. Children under 8 years of age are admitted free.

Tickets to La Ronde's rides may be purchased individually for 15 cents per unit, or in books of 36 for \$5 (a \$6.50 value) and 84 for \$10 (a \$14.45 value).

The Métro is the easiest way to get to La Ronde, letting you off right at the grounds at the Île Ste.Hélène station. Or, take the 168 bus from the Peel Métro station, or the 169 from the Papineau station. Both buses will deposit you right at the turnstiles.
