IV. INTERIOR EXHIBITS

DESTINATION: MOON:

consists of actual size Mercury, Gemini and Apollo components suspended from dome frame; also simulated lunar landscape supports full scale Lunar Excursion Module

and Surveyor

THE AMERICAN SPIRIT:

consists of folk art artifacts such as Indian ornaments, dolls, quilts, inventions, campaign memorabilia, decoys, santos, guitars, cowboy hardware, hats.

AMERICAN PAINTING NOW:

consists of large-scale paintings ranging in height from 7 to 53 feet (5 stories) and suspended from dome frame; paintings, which represent variety of styles and techniques, are displayed against hugh sailcloth panels which are also suspended from dome frame.

THE AMERICAN CINEMA:

"A TIME TO PLAY":

consists of giant photo-enlargements of Hollywood stars such as Gary Cooper and Humphrey Bogart; actual Hollywood props such as the chariot used in "Ben Hur" (1926) and the catapult from "The Tale of Two Cities" (1935); and actual film clips from notable Hollywood films. Stars will also make personal appearances.

This 3-screen, 18 minute, color film is about children's games and how these games reflect the universality of human experience; the film features such international games as Hide and Seek, King of the Hill, Johnny on the Pony and Jump Rope.
