

## Marine Life Zoo

Established in the Cluster of Fish, this is composed by three major buildings sponsored by the Japanese Government: the Marine Animals Park where visitors can see dolphins, sea pigs and other interesting sea mammals, the Low Water Pool where children can enjoy playing with small fish and crabs. and the Giant Aquarium, the world's biggest water tank where colorful fish will be housed.



### EXPO Beach

This is a grand artificial beach spreading over sand hills and the only bathing place at the site where visitors can bask in the sun or rest in the shade of trees.

A restful, idyllic spot where Sago Palms, Adan (a kind of Pandanus) and other semitropical plants grow in clusters.



# Cluster of Pavilions on "Ships" Many model ships from the

first ancient vessels to today's nuclear ships can be seen at the International Sea Vessels Pavilion and at the Japanese non-government pavilions. The model ships will gaily parade in a huge water tank with an area of approximately 500m2 (600sq. yds.) in the International Sea Vessels Pavilion.





Sight-seeing vessels will start from this port. On the sea nearby, many types of sailing vessels from foreign countries anchor as the ship exhibition. Enjoyable attractions are also held on the water.

# — EXPO'75 THEME —

The Exposition area consists of a million square meters of land and water. The land portion is hilly arc-shape and running north-south for 4,000 meters.

Within the EXPO grounds, all pavilions and facilities are connected to each other by a super modern transit system, and movement of the visitors, in addition to the above, is considered to flow smoothly along a principal road with ones radiating in all directions destinating for the clusters and other facilities.

And, whole mountainous EXPO grounds are slightly on the slope towards the sea, the visitors accordingly enjoy a fine view setting of Sesoko Island off the coast from any location of the grounds.



## OKINAWA - Attractive Tourist Destination


Okinawa is located at north latitude 26° 12' and east longitude 127° 39', that is Japan's southernmost prefecture. Okinawa is one of the Ryukyus of which the rest are Miyako and Yaeyama groups. Of the Okinawan group, the largest is Okinawa Honto, where EXPO'75 is held.

The land is lush and green with the sub-tropical bloom, the seas are cobalt blue. By the clear waters of the Japan Current, Okinawa is decorated with the unique flowers, fish and coral of southern climes averaging about 72°F yearly.

The Ryukyus had long been influenced by the Continent, chiefly ancient China, and traditional culture is seen in the manners, customs, dialect and articles of local handicraft.

Shopping for handicraft items must be the highlight of a trip to Okinawa. Lacquer ware, pottery and Bingata (Batik-type fabrics)







are quite unique.
