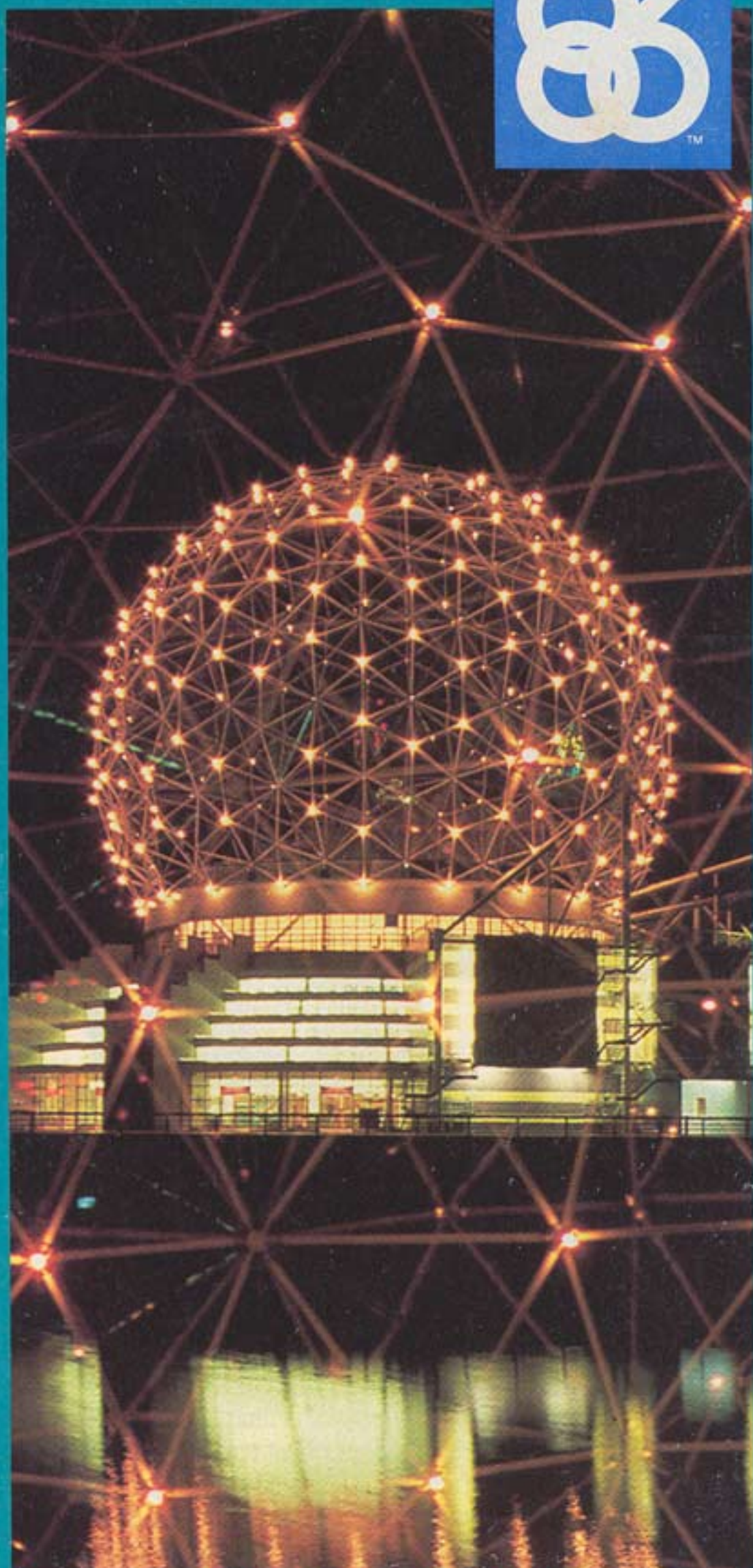

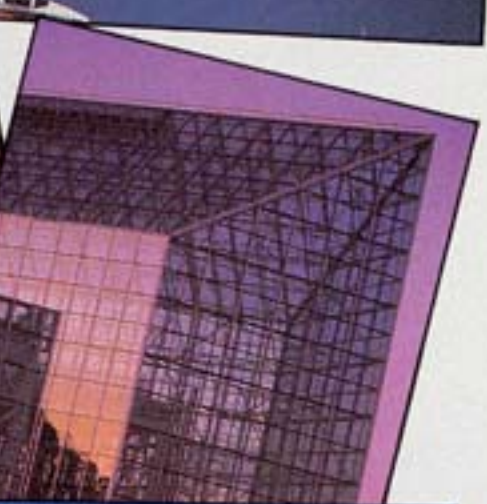
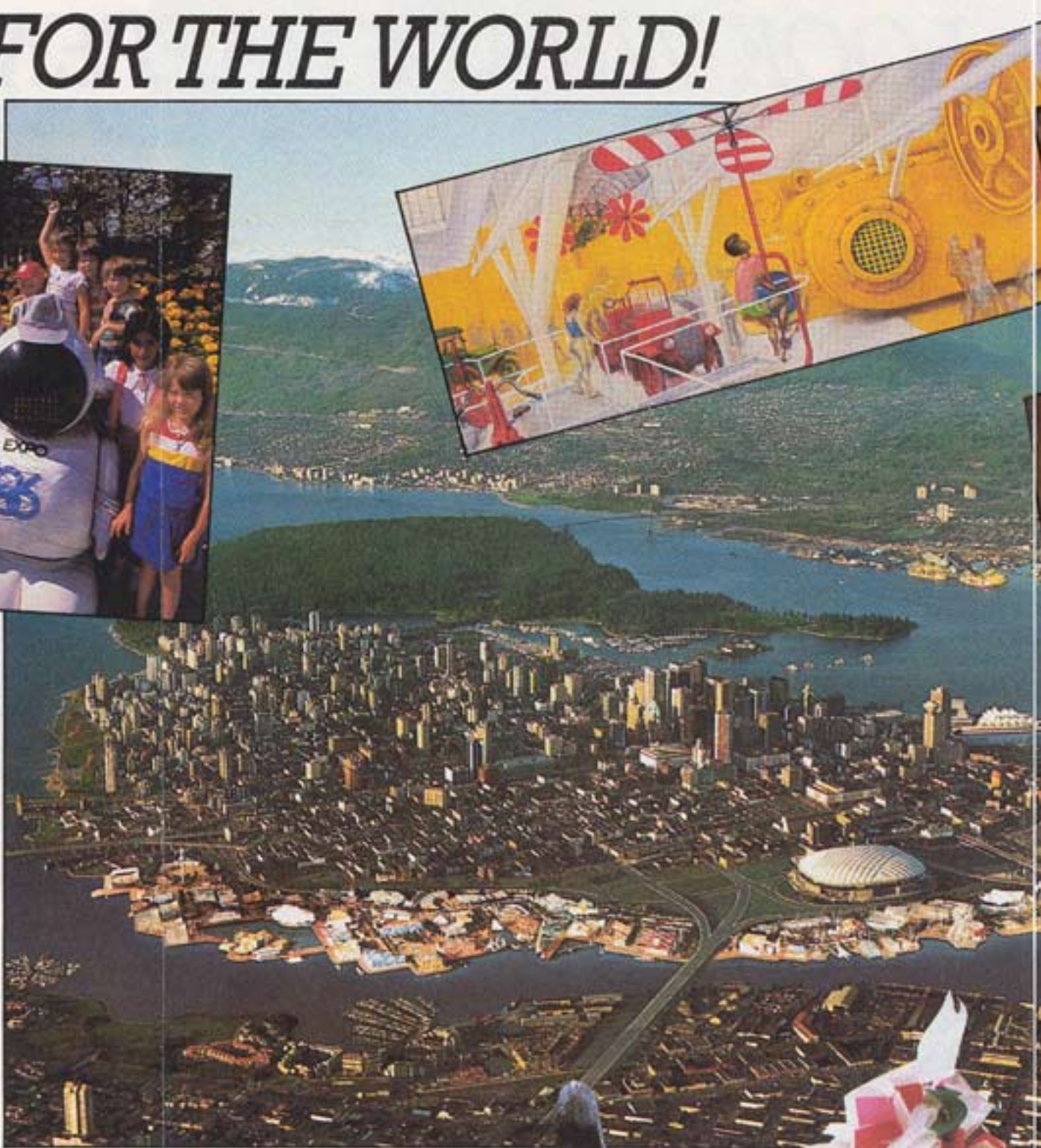

■ **What is EXPO 86?** Sanctioned by the International Bureau of Expositions, EXPO 86 is a special category exposition with the theme of transportation and communications. Its theme statement, World in Motion—World in Touch, points to the Exposition's concern for the human dimensions of technology.

■ **Where?** EXPO 86 will take place on 173 waterfront acres in downtown Vancouver. Pavilions will be located along the scenic False Creek inlet and on Burrard Inlet—Vancouver's spectacular natural harbor.

■ **Are there services for the disabled?** Yes. Extensive arrangements for the mobility, sight and hearing impaired are being made now. The entire site is wheelchair accessible, and motorized chairs will be available. A guide to services and facilities for the disabled will be available early in 1986.
