Theme: "Fun and Fantasy - Leisure in Germany"

Exhibit: The focal point of the pavilion is a film, 1-2-3 Germany funtastic kaleidoscreen which shows the impact technology has had on leisure activities in the Federal Republic of Germany.

Exhibits range from an ultra-lightweight aircraft with a new form of propulsion to a convertible sports car and from an off-road hunting vehicle to a hang-glider. Yachts and amphibious vehicles feature in the maritime section. Around 20 firms from the Federal Republic of Germany present their products for leisure activities.

Entertainment: A dancing water fountain reacts to sound (live music, radio/tape music and human voices). The fountain shoots columns of water up in the air and as it reacts to sounds, the columns change height. In the evening they also change colour. Outside the pavilion there is also entertainment.

Exhibit: The Aegean is the central theme of the Greek Pavilion which recreates its cultural history.
