
1968 World's Fair


One of five nations appearing in the Pavilion of Central America at HemisFair'68.




Age-old craft skills produce beautiful textiles in Bolivia.












### THE COUNTRIES OF EUROPE . . .

## THE UNITED STATES...



 UNITED STATES CONFLUENCE THEATER, part of the two-building Federal Exhibit at HemisFair/68, is a 70-foot high structure which houses a one-of-a-kind theater and the largest curvilinear motion picture screen in the world. In it, fairgoers will see the Francis Thompson film, "Confluence, U.S.A."

 U. S. EXHIBIT PAVILION: The United States Exhibit Pavilion is one of the two buildings which comprise the U. S. Exhibit at Hemisfair/68. In this modern structure, fairgoers are introduced to the exhibit theme, "Confluence, U.S.A."



# **CONFLUENCE / COSMOS**



CONFLUENCE/COSMOS, the theme exhibit for HEMISFAIR '68, is a startling adventure. The visitor is given the opportunity here to relive the many ways man has experienced the universe. By creating a series of six mood areas, the exhibit takes the visitor from the past into the present and even offers a glimpse of the future. The visitor's venture into the universe begins in the darkened introductory hall under an illuminated dome that represents the heavens. Here, he discovers one of the basic facts of the universe: it moves.

The six sections that follow the introductory hall work with that essential fact. The visitor now enters an area devoted to the sun and man's past and present awareness of that body. Graphic displays, models and other visual techniques introduce the visitor here to the phenomena of our environment. Near at hand, giant instruments, including the atomic clock, illustrate the different principles that apply to the measurement of time.

Next comes the section devoted to the moon. And the visitor gets a better understanding of this body, of its mysterious fascination, by experiencing some of the visual imagery of the ancient moon cults.

Stars appear next in their own section. Here, Homer's description of Ulysses' use of the stars to navigate home to ancient Greece becomes the introduction. Overhead theaters continue the story of the stars and navigation with pictures of some of the earliest navigation instruments.



The fourth section of the exhibit is devoted to astronomy, the science of celestial bodies. Here the visitor feels almost suspended between two areas demonstrating ancient concepts of the universe. Changing images projected on screens bring the visitor well into the present where he is introduced to some of the contemporary tools used by scientists today to explore the universe.

In the fifth section, the exhibit portrays the history of flight from dirigibles through the Wright Brothers to supersonic jets. Here, too, the visitor is given a better insight into how man has been prepared for his current great adventure: the leap into space.



Finally, the exhibit undertakes to explain the meaning and purpose of space flight. Vivid pictorial events here demonstrate the contributions of both the United States and the Soviet Union to the exploration of space. In fact, the visitor here actually goes into simulated orbit.

CONFLUENCE/COSMOS, the visitor realizes that space exploration has brought mankind to the edge of a new frontier. And crossing that frontier will bring even greater understanding of man himself and his home planet, Earth.

# THE STATE OF TEXAS AND



- THEATRE AND RIVER COURT. The extension of the San Antonio River into the theatre courtyard will enable fairgoers to enter the HemisFair grounds by gondolas from downtown river points.
- SAN ANTONIO CONVENTION CENTER. Much of Hemisforits unique entertainment and fine arts program will be held in this 2,800-most theatre, a 10,500-sect arena, and 200,000-square-foot exhibit hall — the largest single complex of buildings on the site.

- THE INSTITUTE OF TEXAN CULTURES, the State of Texas exhibit at Hemisfair'68, tells the story of Texans, who they are and where they came from. The Institute will remain after Hemisfair as a permanent part of San Antonio.
- HEADQUARTERS, HEMISFAIR'68. Strung with Mexican lanterns by night, the center of HemisFair activity structure was originally the German-English School, the grammar school for the children of German families in San Antolio.



# THE WORLD OF INDUSTRY AND INSTITUTIONS...



 THE BELL SYSTEM. An inviting fantasy land where adults, teenagers, and young children all get a chance to play "games" with some of the most advanced telephone equipment that exists today. Also houses attended telephone center.

● LONE STAR PAVILION, sponsored by Lone Star Brewing Company, contains the Lone Star, a refreshment center, and the Texas Hall of History, a oneof-a-kind exhibit of memorable events in the state's fabled history.





- COCA-COLA COMPANY brings theater to the fair. Here, in its 500-seat theater, the company presents the puppers of Sid and Marty Krofft in a special play called Kaleidoscope.
- HUMBLE OIL turned the old Schultze warehouse store into a traveland tour center for Fairgoers. Inside, too, is a delightful exhibit of models depicting man's efforts to move himself and his goods from place to place.





 THE GENERAL ELECTRIC PAVILION. In a futuristic building, General Electric presents the story of electrical living in the Southwest from the time the first lights blazed in the San Antonio Opera House to the present.

 PEARL PAVILION. Pearl Brewing Company's Pavilion, with indoor and outdoor dining, refreshment and entertainment areas, evokes the charming mood of the turn-of-the-century, with jazz musical entertainment.





 FRITO-LAY/PEPSI-COLA presents Los Voladores de Papantla, the Flying Indians of Papantla, in a breathtaking performance of ancient dramatic rituals.





 GENERAL MOTORS provides fairgoers with a fascinaring glimpse into the future of travel and transit plus a look at some experimental automotive developments in its imposing pavilion overlooking the Lake.

> IBM: LAKESIDE. Key feature of the IBM Lakeside Pavilion, one of two the corporation has constructed on site, is a light-hearted informative movie explaining the operation of modern computers.





 KODAK PAVILION — Visitors to the Eastman-Kodak Pavilion are introduced to the complexities and delights of film and filmcraft in all its many forms.

> • IBM: DURANGO. The IBM Durango Pavilion, one of two the corporation has constructed on site, houses a unique, computer-operated loom that will a sample of cloth for the visitor.

- FIESTA ISLAND, a beguiling area, landscaped with diversion in mind to hold rides, games, food klosks and amusements in a picture-book setting of walks and waterways, shaded sitting areas and tree-lined paths.
- MINI-MONORAIL is one of the chief transportation means on the HemisFair'68 site. It is quick, colorful and provides a breathtaking view of the exposition's entire 92 acres.





 CALYPSO, one of nearly 20 fantastic rides that dot the landscape of Fiesta Island and the areas about the Tower of the Americas. Many of these are imported; many to be shown here for the first time.
