

## Fare Ladies Go to the Fair

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TWO Washington home economists will cook up some famous White House recipes at the New York World's Fair today through Sunday.

Joan Durno and Nancy Llewellyn of the Washington Gas Light Company's Home Service Bureau left yesterday for New York, where they will give four demonstrations daily for four days at the Theatre of Food in the Festival of Gas Pavilion at the Fair.

The White House recipes they will demonstrate are from "White House Menus and Recipes" by Francois Rysavy as told to Frances Spatz Leighton. Chef Rysavy was White House Chef during the Eisenhower Admin-

istration and part of the Kennedy Administration.

VIP recipes to be featured by Miss Durno and Mrs. Llewellyn at the Fair include Savarin Ring, a rich and beautiful dessert which Chef Rysavy described as his greatest triumph.

Another White House favorite, Rock Cornish game hens with pate de foie gras and wild rice, will also be featured. This entree was served at a White House dinner given by the late President John F. Kennedy and Mrs. Kennedy in honor of the late Gen. Douglas MacArthur, July 20, 1961, and at an earlier dinner given by President and Mrs. Dwight D. Eisenhower for Chief Justice Earl Warren.

Printed copies of the White House food specialties will be given to visitors at the pavilion. The recipes are available to local homemakers who call or write the Washington Gas Light Company's Home Service.
