a real Merry-Go-Round . . .

60 Years in New York . . .

After a half-century at Coney Island, the famous amusement park's prime feature — the Feltman Carousel — now rides endlessly at the New York World's Fair...a bit of fun and nostalgia in a fair dominated by the ultra-modern and the futuristic.

Carousel Fun & Food Park stands at the end of Meadow Lake Bridge, convenient to all entrances, and providing the keynote to the new Lake Area.

Ziegfeld Girls and Diamond Jim . . .

Feltman's merry-go-round attracted untold millions to Coney Island — including Ziegfeld girls and presidents, Diamond Jim Brady and Lillian Russell, stars and diplomats, the great and the unsung. Galloping around and around are the same 76 steeds carved in 1903 by Marcus Charles Illions. The machinery of the Fair's Carousel was pieced together from several carousels. The Stubbman, rebuilt at Coney Island in 1923, provided the weatherproof frame; two military band organs of German make — one, the largest such organ extant — were installed to provide traditional carousel music from their 453 reeds, full brass and woodwind choirs, and percussion.

Outdoor Cafeteria . . .

Across the boardwalk from the merry-go-round, a unique outdoor cafeteria surrounds the ride in a semi-circle. A variety of foods is offered, ranging from the least expensive food at the Fair to complete meals. Prices range from one of the last remaining 25-cent hot dogs to the \$1.39 Golden Brown Chicken Dinner. Specialties, not generally available throughout the Fairgrounds, include corn-on-the-cob and watermelon.

Special events are highlighted by Dancing Under the Stars to all kinds of music...a live baby elephant...gaily dressed waitresses...a clown for the kids...an enchanting, fun atmosphere for a budget lunch or supper, an exciting ride, and dining and dancing on a summer night.
