GREYHOUND SIGHTSEEING TOURS

These are the Lectured Tours as distinguished from the Transit Services described on the opposite side of this folder.

The **Grand Sightseeing Bus Tour** is conducted in air conditioned buses with all forward-facing, upholstered, reclining seats. This equipment features glass-panelled roofs, large picture windows and a quiet atmosphere for full enjoyment of the electronic description of the Fair's attractions. The tour traverses all of the major thoroughfares, passing close to most of the exhibit buildings. It provides a fine opportunity to acquaint oneself with the broad plan and content of the Fair, after which individual areas can more readily be explored. The tour requires about $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, depending on traffic.


Those desiring shorter tours of only parts of the Fair will find **Glide-a-ride Tours "A" and "B"** exciting. These electronically narrated tours are provided in specially designed open-air-vehicles for full enjoyment of both the sights and sounds of the Fair. Either Tour "A" or Tour "B" requires about 45 minutes, depending on traffic, and each travels different areas with practically no duplication of routes.



UNDER 12 ADHLTS Deluxe lectured tour—covers entire Fair. Sightseeing Scenicruisers feature glass roofs, air conditioning, picture windows and fully reclining seats. Tour takes about 1½ hours, depending on traffic. Tour starts at Gotham Gate (No. 1) where tickets may be purchased at Greyhound Booth. Tour may also be boarded at intermediate stops shown on this map by paying fare to driver, who issues receipt for your purchase. Intermediate stops are marked by WHITE "Grand Sightseeing Bus Tour" signs on light poles. When boarding at such intermediate stop, you still enjoy the complete tour, leaving the bus at the place you boarded, as it is a continuous tour. Tickets may also be purchased at any of the Official World's Fair Information Booths which are staffed by Greyhound Golden Girls. Blue Pkg. 

SEE MAP TO RIGHT




Greyhound provides two-way transit bus service on a perimeter route around the Fairgrounds. The fare for each one-way ride is 25c for each passenger over two years old and there are no transfer privileges. The driver announces stops and principal exhibits near each stop. Bus stations on the perimeter route are readily recognized by the familiar blue and white color and Greyhound dog.

GLIDE-A-RIDE TRANSIT SERVICE



This identification is carried out by flags and signs on the vehicles, signs on light poles at stops, and in a painted stripe of the same color in the middle, of the roadway.
