## **PARKING**

Male toll collectors and male parking field attendants will be utilized at the bus and car parking lots.

## **POLICE**

The World's Fair Police Department will have duties similar to those of a municipal police force. Selected applicants will undergo extensive training in police procedures. Part time work will also be available.

## **FIRE**

Employment opportunities in the Fire Department will be extremely limited, and available only to experienced firemen.

## **FIRST AID**

All medical personnel must be fully qualified in their professions. (Registered Nurse, N. Y. State Fully Licensed M.D.)

## **PERSONNEL IDENTIFICATION**

There will be a few jobs available to men and women experienced in employee photographing, identification, and fingerprinting.

## **ADMINISTRATION AND CLERICAL**

There will be a very limited number of supervisory and office jobs available to persons experienced in similar positions.



*April 22, 1964 will mark the opening of the greatest show in history. **ADMISSIONS**

Female cashiers and ticket sellers will handle money at the entrances, exhibits and concessions at the Fair. Male ushers and ticket takers will be responsible for the safety, comfort, and orderliness of the Fair's guests at the main entrance or attractions.

In addition to having technical competence, every employee must be skilled in "grass roots" public relations. In many departments we can teach the mechanics of the job, but it is essential that candidates have mastered the art of getting along with people. Our employees will be "Front Line", greeting all the visitors to the Fair, and must, of necessity, be our public relations representatives—neat, cordial, pleasant and courteous.

All employees must be United States citizens, have no criminal record, and be fingerprinted. Police and fire applicants must be at least 21, of average height and weight, and qualify by passing a physical examination. The minimum age is 18 for all other departments.

One of the reasons for Pinkerton's service record of high quality has been the extreme care with which its employees are selected. All personnel are carefully screened and investigated to insure that only those of outstanding character and ability are employed. Employment with Pinkerton's provides a reference that is hard to equal.

Selection will be based on interest, attitude, personality, appearance, English and foreign language speaking ability, work experience, education, poise and intelligence. PREFERENCE WILL BE GIVEN TO PERSONS ABLE TO WORK FOR THE ENTIRE OPERATING PERIOD.

Wages will generally be higher than those paid in comparable jobs. Most employees will be required to join a union and to work on weekends and holidays. Most jobs will require uniforms that will be furnished at no cost to employees. There will be many more qualified applicants than there will be available jobs, and no one can be promised a job without a personal interview.
