REMEMBER ! IMPORTANT NEWS FROM WARDROBE!

Coats, capes, parkas, men's trench coats, etc., are NOT to be put

in the lockers overnight. They must be turned in to the Wardrobe Department each and every night. The lockers are too small for them and they get much too wrinkled when they're forced inside with your other wardrobe. Be SURE that the wardrobe you return each night is that which has been assigned to you. Remember, everyone has his own wardrobe number and any item you turn in MUST bear that number. When you turn in a piece of wardrobe belonging to another Host or Hostess, your "wardrobe issue sheet" will still be charged with the item bearing YOUR personal number. A wardrobe price-list will be posted in a week or so and a charge will be made for any and all items issued to YOU which you have not returned. It is important that you remember this, so you will not misunderstand this fact later in the season. While we're on the subject, it should be pointed out that the Wardrobe Department will be closed from 8:30 to 9:30 each evening, beginning tonight, to permit the person on duty to have dinner.

"IT'S A SMALL WORLD" WARDROBE REGULATIONS

"It's A Small World" is now played on a two acre stage, and during its two year run, an estimated 70 million visitors will have the opportunity to see it. How you dress and how you look are of vital importance to maintain the illusion of this show, and to create the best possible impression of Disneyland, Walt Disney Productions, The Pepsi-Cola Company, and UNICEF, as well as the New York World's Fair and the people of the United States.

To make sure the show is perfect at all times, these wardrobe regulations apply to all:

GENERAL RULES:

- 1. The "It's A Small World" Wardrobe Supervisor will approve all costumes worn by on stage personnel.
- 2. Wedding and engagement rings, watches, and tie clips are the only approved jewelry to be worn on stage, unless otherwise authorized by Wardrobe.
- 3. Any defect in your uniform or costume is to be reported to the Wardrobe Department as soon as possible. It is the responsibility of the personnel to see that each item of wardrobe is clean and in proper condition. Should your wardrobe become soiled or damaged during your working hours, it should be immediately reported.
- 4. Uniforms or costumes will not be worn away from the "Small World", except during your lunch period.
- 5. Personnel handling food must comply with State and local laws. Female personnel must wear hair nets which confine the hair.
- 6. There is to be absolutely no smoking, gum chewing, hair combing, application of make-up, etc., etc., within view of the audience.

PERSONAL REQUIREMENTS - MEN

- l. Men must have clean shaves and neat, trim haircuts.
- 2. Men must have clean dark socks and well-shined black shoes.

PERSONAL REQUIREMENTS - WOMEN

- Women must comply with the "natural look". Only conservative hair styles, modest make-up, and clear nail polish will be worn. Hair shall be natural in color. Hair shall not be back-combed or ratted. Make-up shall not include eye shadow or eye liner. Length of fingernail tips shall not exceed one eighth of an inch. Extreme perfumes should not be used.
- 2. Women must have clean, white shoes with a brown one inch stacked heel, except Pepsi Hostesses who must have all white oxfords.

IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT ALL PERSONNEL ABIDE BY THESE REGULATIONS TO MAINTAIN THE HIGH STANDARD FOR WHICH WE ARE KNOWN AND RESPECTED, by jiminy:
