The Republic of China Pavilion at the world's Fair is staging an all-star musical variety show to celebrate the Independence Day of the United States.

The 20-minute show, featuring eight leading Chinese performers in a compact programme of Chinese music and dance, will be given free at the China Pavilion every half hour from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m. and from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. on Saturday, July 3 and Sunday, July 4.

In announcing the event, Dr. Tse-yen Tung, China Pavilion's Commissioner General made the following remarks: "We take great pleasure in presenting this programme not just as a measure to help promote the Fair, but, above all, as an expression of the Chinese people's friendship and goodwill toward the people of the United States."

The programme, consisting of Chinese dances, songs and instrument solos and ensembles, is arranged by Mr. K. Y. Ai of the China Institute in America.

Among the performers are: Miss Hung-yen Hu, Chinese opera performer and dancer; Miss Josephine Chang, butterfly harp soloist, Miss Elizabeth Chang, vocalist and Mr. Kim-man Ying, Chinese flutist. All of them are well-known musicians in New York's sizable Chinese community.
