Theme: In spite of long distance between Brisbane and Kobe, they are connected by water of Pacific Ocean represented here by water in 'Mizugei'.

Exhibit: This takes the form of a booth inside the Technoplaza Pavilion. Kobe City brings the wonders of water at the Mizugei water show, which is performed by Australian women who were trained in Kobe City. Watch water magically appear from swords, fans and clothing. A live ten-minute performance of traditional Mizugei is held every hour. A robot member of the performing group parrots the movements of the women.

Multivision screens present the diverse sights and sounds of water. Also in the pavilion is a display which informs visitors about the Far East and South Pacific Games for the Disabled (to be held in Kobe in 1989).

Korea - Home of the 1988 Olympics and more Theme:

Exhibit: The Korea Pavilion consists of the "Culture Zone", "Prosperity Zone" and Olympic Corner. In the pavilion forecourt a hexagonal pavilion boasting beautiful Korean architecture and a classic Korean gate, welcomes visitors. The "Culture Zone" features Korea's traditional leisure activities. This zone also hosts a replica of the Golden Crown (excavated from a king's tomb of the Shilla Kingdom in 57 BC) and examples of blue celadon pottery (from the Koryo Dynasty AD 918 - 1932).

A replica of the main Seoul Olympic stadium stands in The Olympic Corner.

The "Prosperity Zone" reveals Korea's advancing technical levels in areas such as automobiles, electronic goods and sporting wear.

A 20-minute video introducing Korean history, culture, tourism and economic development runs 15 times daily.

Entertainment: The pavilion hosts folk dances. During Korea Week, traditional Korean folk dances, a classic costumes show and Taekwondo demonstrations can be seen. Folk dances include fan dances, flower crown dances, the farmers' dance and drum dance, all of which reflect the roots of the Korean people.

A full-service Korean restaurant serves Restaurant: traditional food, including dishes such as Beef Bone Steak (Bul gal bi), Short Beef Rib Soup (Gal bi tang), Rice Mixed Vegetables and Beef (Bibimbab), Beef Combination Soup (Gom tang) and Cold Noodles in Broth (Naengmyun). Hours: 10am - 10pm. All credit cards accepted.
