JULY 8, 1952: SOVIET NOTIFIES U.S. THAT HER EM-BASSY IN MOSCOW MUST BE VACATED BY END OF YEAR. Here's how handwritten numerals are recognized by the IBM Character Recognition System. A spot of light from a cathode tube "looks" at the card and traverses the area 3 until it strikes a portion of a written numeral.

It then follows around its contour until it returns to the starting point.

A comparison of this pattern is made with a stored computer pattern 333333333333 and it is then recognized. 12 4567890

The spot of light then moves on to the next number at the rate of 200 characters per second. When the entire date is read, it is relayed to the IBM 1460 computer system which searches its disk files for the news of that day. The IBM 1404

printer is then instructed to print the news on this card.
