NEW YORK, June 19 -- Governor John Anderson, Jr., of Kansas, accompanied by an official party of forty Kansas bankers, industrialists, chamber of commerce officers, city managers and the members of the Kansas Economic Development Commission, will arrive in New York City Wednesday, June 24th, for a jam-packed three-day schedule of official functions.

Governor Anderson, who was Chairman of the 1964 National Governor's Conference, and President of the Council of State Governments will lead the group in "Kansas Day At The New York World's Fair" ceremonies, and will christen a New York World Fair "State of Kansas" subway car. He will host a Waldorf reception for distinguished alumni of Kansas colleges and universities and officers of New York firms having Kansas branches or plants. He will be tendered a reception by the officers of the Chemical Bank New York Trust Company and a luncheon by the officers of the First National City Bank of New York.

Innovation in the christening of the subway car will be the sprinkling of Kansas wheat instead of the usual champagne bottle breaking. The wheat, major agricultural crop of the State of Kansas, is representative of the State's diversified economy now supported by both agriculture and industry. The underframes on the Times-Square, World-Fair, Flushing line of the IRT are manufactured in Atchinson, Kansas, by the LFM Manufacturing Company.

Participating in the ceremonies at the Fair and in the subway car dedication will be Miss Suzy Beck, a 19-year-old Manhattan, Kansas, beauty who was recently crowned "Miss Wool of America 1964-65." She will be the only distaff member of the delegation attending both ceremonies.

Mr. Joseph E. O'Grady, Chairman of the New York City Transit Authority, and other city transit officials will participate in the subway car dedication at the subway system siding at the New York World Fair entrance.

Colonel John J. McGann will represent Governor Rockefeller. The special military aide to the New York State Governor will meet the Kansas delegation on arrival and will accompany the group to the Subway car and Frir ceremonies.

During the day's activities, Governor Anderson will be presented with a medallion by the World's Fair Corporation and in turn will present medallion replicas of the Kansas State Seal to Mr. Robert Moses and to Governor Rockefeller through Colonel McGann.

General William E. Potter, Executive Vice President, Mr. Michael R. Pender, Director of Federal and State Exhibits, and Mr. William R. Beckett, Assistant Chief of Protocol, will greet the group on their arrival at the Fair and will with U.S. Ambassador Norman K. Winston, U.S. Vorld's Fair Commissioner, participate in the Kansas Day ceremonies.

The World Fair will hold a reception for the Kansas group at the Millstone Restaurant of the New England Village and Governor Anderson will host a luncheon for World Fair officials and Governor Rockefeller's representatives. The Kansas group will be the guest of the General Motors Corporation and will visit the G.M. Pavilion at the Fair on Friday, the 26th, before returning to Kansas.
