New York World's Fair, March 19 -- Fair President Robert Moses announced today that a 2500-pound bronze replica of the Liberty Bell which stands at Independence Hall, Philadelphia, will be installed on the opening day of "Pennsylvania Week" at the World's Fair, June 13-19.

On June 13, Governor William W. Scranton will head a large delegation for the dedication ceremonies at the Court of the Universe where the historic Liberty Bell will remain during the rest of the Fair season. The week-long program is sponsored by the Governors's Committee of 100,000 Pennsylvanians for the Promotion of Economic Growth.

In making the announcement, Mr. Moses said: "The Fair is proud to be host to the Committee and its unique exhibit. It will be one of the great new attractions this summer. Far more important, is the opportunity millions of visitors will have to view this important replica of the national shrine."

Two prominent Pennsylvanians, Arthur C. Kaufmann, Philadelphia civic leader and Chairman of Pennsylvania Week at the Fair, and M. George Mooradian, executive director of the "100,000 Pennsylvanians" met recently with General William E. Potter, Fair Executive Vice President, to complete arrangements for the exhibit.

The Pennsylvanians recently returned from France where an order was placed for the replica to be cast at the renowned bell foundry located in Annecy-le-Vieux, a small town near the Swiss border. The completed Bell will be shipped to the United States and installed at the Court of the Universe.

After the close of the Fair the Liberty Bell will be placed in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania the State Capitol.

Last year, Governor Scranton, his wife and three sons led a huge turnout of many thousands from the Keystone State in marking "Pennsylvania State Day" at the New York World's Fair. At that time the Governor called the Fair, "most thrilling, full of grandeur, dignity and education. Surely its theme, 'Peace Through Understanding' is carried out fully by the brilliant exhibits displayed by the foreign countries. This theme should be that of the whole world."
