NEW YORK WORLD'S FAIR, Mar. 5 -- The new and exciting 26 1/2-minute technicolor film, "TO THE FAIR", which portrays the fun and excitement of the New York World's Fair, will receive nation-wide exposure through theatrical bookings before the opening of the 1965 Fair season, Wednesday, April 21, Robert Moses, president of the Fair Corporation, announced today.

The film will appear in twenty-five Loew's Theatres in the New York City-New Jersey area. It is currently playing at the Capitol on Broadway, Metropolitan, Valencia, Paradise, New Rochelle, White Plains, Orpheum, Kings, Oriental, Triboro and other theatres.

"TO THE FAIR" also will be shown in twenty-three out-of-town Loew's Theatres, in such key cities as Atlanta, Boston, Buffalo, Cleveland, Columbus, Evansville, Houston, Miami, Indianapolis, Memphis, New Haven, New Orleans, St. Louis, Syracuse, Providence, Washington and Wilmington.

Eleven Century Theatres in Brooklyn and Long Island, eight
Associated Playhouses on Long Island, and seven in the Paramount Theatre
Circuit of Pennsylvania also have scheduled the delightful Fair
entertainment film.

Theatrical bookings are handled by Cain Productions, Inc., 1501 Broadway, N.Y.C. In addition, four hundred 16mm prints are available for non-theatrical distribution to schools, churches, community organizations and other institutional groups through Association Films, Inc., Broad and Elm Streets, Ridgefield, N. J.

"TO THE FAIR" was produced by Francis Thompson, whose Johnson's Wax film, "TO BE ALIVE", played before capacity crowds during the 1964 Fair and received a special award from the New York Film Critics. Emphasizing the fun of fairgoing, the film has tremendous appeal and should be an important factor in attracting a great number of visitors to the 1965 World's Fair, says Fair president Moses.

Association Films, Inc., with six distribution branch offices, located in Ridgefield, N. J.; La Grange, Ill.; Dallas, Tex.; Oakmont, Pa.; Hayward, Calif.; and Toronto, Ontario, also has two hundred 16mm prints for television distribution in the United States and Canada. More than 100 prints also have been purchased by Fair exhibitors and transportation companies for extensive promotional efforts.

Besides the World's Fair film, "TO THE FAIR", an additional forty films about the Fair, produced by Fair and non-Fair exhibitors (transportation firms), are also in circulation.

The Fair's film is expected to be seen by approximately 25 to 30 million people, and it is estimated it will be shown 30,000 times in schools, churches, fraternities, conventions and civic and business organization meetings.
