NEW YORK WORLD'S FAIR, May 25 -- "Civil Service Day", honoring employees of the federal, state, city and local government, will take place at the New York World's Fair on Monday, May 31.

More than 10,000 public servants are expected for the special program featuring a variety of demonstrations by government agencies in the Fair's Singer Bowl. The events will get underway at 11:00 A.M., and continue through 4:00 P.M.

Also, at the Federal Pavilion, federal, state and city department displays will be open until 10 P.M.

Sponsored for the second time at the Fair by the Civil Service Leader, the comprehensive program is free to all Fairgoers. Both Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller and Mayor Robert F. Wagner have recognized the event in proclamations officially declaring May 31, "Civil Service Day."

A message paying tribute to the work of government employees is also expected from President Lyndon B. Johnson.

One of the features at the Bowl will be the selection and presentation of awards to the four most beautiful girls representing the four levels of government. From many hundreds of aspirants, six nominees in each group will be judged in the "Miss Civil Service" contest starting at 12:50 P.M.
